Unaffiliated Show Jumping Rules

- 1) Classes 40cm and 50cm will be run as Single Phase (the horse and rider combinations going clear will be entered into a separate jump off). Classes 60cm and above will be run as Two Phase (those horse and rider combinations going clear will be entered into a combined jump off). In the absence of any clear rounds, placings will be decided on combinations with the least number of faults in the quickest times.
- 2)Riders may commence their show jumping round once the judge has rung the bell.
- 3) Faults will be awarded as follows:

Knockdown 4 faults
1st Refusal 4 faults
2nd Refusal 8 faults
3rd Refusal Elimination
Error of course Elimination
Fall of rider Elimination

- 4) Those combinations eliminated are permitted to jump one fence before leaving the ring. In the case of a fall, the rider must wait to be assessed by the First Aider in attendance before leaving the arena on foot. Under no circumstances shall a rider remount their horse whilst still in the arena
- 5) Rosettes for those placed 1st 6th in all classes.
- 6) Trophies awarded to those accumulating the most amount of points during the Show Jumping season.
- 7) In the interest of welfare of the horse, a competitor will be disqualified if the horse is lame, sick or exhausted, in the opinion of the judge. Any misuse of whip, spurs or bit will also result in disqualification.
- 8) Whips should be between 45cm and 75cm long.
- 9) In the interest of welfare, no horse/pony shall compete in more than three classes.
- 10) In the warm-up arena, the practice fence should be no higher than the class in progress.
- 11) BSJA combinations are welcome to enter HC.
- 12) Overall 2023 Season Championship Trophy will be awarded on a points accumulation system. This trophy is awarded at our Awards Evening in December 2024.

Unaffiliated Dressage Rules

- 1) Intro/Prelim/Novice Restricted This section is for any combinations who <u>HAVE NOT</u> placed 1st more than 3 times at this level in the 2023 GFP Season.
- 1a) Intro/Prelim/Novice Open This section is for any combinations that <u>HAVE</u> placed 1st more than 3 times at this level in the 2023 GFP Season.
- 1b) Open and Restricted classes will be judged <u>SEPARATELY</u>. It is the competitors responsibility to ensure they select the correct section when entering via Equo Events. If your entry does not reflect our 2023 results records, your entry will automatically be changed.
- 1c) Open and Restricted will accumulate points separately for the end of year Awards Evening. The overall season Champion will be the combination who has accumulated the most points from either section.
- 2) This season is for unaffiliated riders, however affiliated competitors not above BD Group 6 and combinations that have 1 BD point up to 50 BD points in the current year can compete in Prelim, Novice or Elementary Open classes. Please make note of this in your online entry.
- 3) The event will be run under British Dressage Rules which can be found on their website.
- 4) Only pre-entries will be accepted and valid.
- 5) A £2 late entry fee is applied to entries accepted after the closing date.
- 6)Trophies are awarded to those accumulating the most points throughout the 2024 Season including the Lead Rein Class and ROR Sections.
- 7) Overall 2024 Season Championship Trophy will be awarded on a points accumulation system. This trophy is awarded at our Awards Evening on December 2024.
- 8)The dressage league will run separately and also be done on a points accumulation system. The league Champions will also be awarded a trophies at our Awards Evening in December 2024.
- 9) The ROR section will run throughout the season in levels Unaffiliated Intro and Unaffiliated Prelim (excluding GFP League). This will be judged and placed separately.
- 10) Callers are permitted Intro Elementary. GFP can provide a caller on the day for levels Intro Novice, we ask for a £1 donation to our chosen charity. If you require a caller for Elementary level, we ask that you bring your own.
- 11) From January 2025, Grey Fern Park Equestrian Centre will be running under the new BD tests.

In Hand & Ridden Showing Rules

- 1) All ridden animals must be four years old and over. The age of an animal shall be calculated from the 1st January in the year of its birth.
- 2) No animal or rider may leave the ring without permission of the Judge and Ring Steward. Once a class has commenced there shall be no change of rider or handler.
- 3) A fall of animal or rider whilst mounted in any class will result in disqualification and they MUST leave the ring dismounted. If an animal gets loose from its handler whilst in the ring it will also result in disqualification.
- 4) Animals displaying continued disobedience may, at the discretion of the Judges, be disqualified.
- 5) Riders can be mounted or unmounted for the presentation of rosettes.
- 6) On Health and Safety grounds, all competitors must be in good general health and physically fit to take part.
- 7) Correctly secured British Standard Skull Caps/Riding Hats that meet current Safety Standards MUST be worn by all riders. Correct dress should be worn in all classes and further dictated by requirements of societies/organisations awarding qualifications in named classes.
- 8) Show Canes are not to exceed 75cms (30") in pony classes. Hunting crops are permissible. Bit-less bridles and running gags are not permitted unless otherwise stated in the class specific rules. Boots are not permitted in any classes. No bandages or protective pads on any animal's legs or feet are permissible in any class. See individual organisations rules for entry requirements pertaining to qualification classes.
- 9) Rosettes for those placed 1st 6th in all classes.
- 10) From our overall Championship event in October, trophies will be awarded to both the In Hand and Ridden Overall Champions and the In Hand and Ridden Reserve Champions. These will be presented at our Awards Evening in December 2024.

Criteria & Points Accumulation

Show Jumping

Those placed 1st - 3rd in each of the heights 40cm - 1m will qualify for the Grey Fern Park Show Jumping Championships being held on Sunday 20th October 2024. Qualifying card to be issued and signed by the show secretary.

Dressage

Those attaining a score of 58% or over in Intro to Elementary will qualify for the Grey Fern Park Dressage Championships being held on Sunday 6th October 2024. Qualifying card to be issued and signed by the show secretary.

Those placed 1st - 3rd in each class will qualify for the Grey Fern Park Showing Championships being held on Sunday 13th October 2024. Qualifying card to be issued and signed by the show secretary.

3. EQUIFEST OPEN MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND LEAD REIN

Open to Mountain & Moorland ponies, registered with their respective Pure Bred Societies of Dartmoor, Exmoor, New Forest, Shetland and Welsh A or B. Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, not exceeding 128cms. Riders not to have attained their 9th birthday before 1st January in the current year. To be led by an attendant and shown in a Snaffle Bridle, the lead rein to be attached to the noseband only.

18. EQUIFEST OPEN RIDDEN HACKS

Open Show Hacks, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 160cms. Riders any age.

Stallion, mare or gelding, 15 years old and over. Any type or breed. Rider any age. Classes may be divided according to entries.

- No competitor must not show an animal that has been owned, leased, loaned or produced by the judge to the best of their knowledge. The competitor agrees that they have investigated this to the best of their ability.
- Novice; Not to have won more than x2 1st prior to the 1st January in the current year
- Junior; 18yrs and under. Junior age to be taken on the 1st January in the current year
- Home Produced; Horse/pony is shown from a private or DIY yard and shown by a person who does not produce horses for the show ring for financial gain
- Various show series have different rules as well as those for EASA, these
 will be read and followed by the competitor. Those shows that hold
 affiliated classes will use the rules from the affiliation body.
- The competitor is responsible for their own points collecting. Each point awarded must be stamped by the show secretary on the day of the event. Points cannot be backdated or stamped by other secretaries. If points cards are lost, the competitor will start from zero points again.
- Awards are handed out at the end of year awards evening. Attendance is mandatory should you wish to receive your award.

- 7) No horse boxes or lorries to be mucked out in car park and all horse droppings must be placed in receptacles and areas provided.
- 8) Smoking is only permitted in the designated parking areas.
- 9) All children under 16 years of age must be supervised by a responsible adult.
- 10) All rubbish is to be placed in the bins provided.
- 11) Hard hats conforming to PAS 015:2011, VG1 01.040 2014-12 This standard must also have either a BSI Kitemark or a Inspec IC Mark, ASTM F1163 2004a or 04a onwards This standard must also have a SEI mark, SNELL E2016, AS/NZS 3838 2006 onwards This standard must also have a SAI Global Mark. We recommend that approved body protectors are worn whilst mounted.
- 12) Permission must be sort for stallions to be entered into any classes and handlers must be 14 years of age or older. Appropriate ribbons worn in tail to indicate any horse that may require caution: Blue Stallion, Green Inexperienced Youngster, Red Kicker/Temperamental
- 13) No refunds will be given once classes have been entered unless cancelled by Grey Fern Park Equestrian Centre. We reserve the right to cancel or amend any classes or competitions as we see fit.
- 14) The judge's decision is final in all cases.
- 15) No behaviour of an offensive, abusive, or unpleasant manner to any persons at Grey Fern Park Equestrian Centre will be tolerated. This also includes via social media, internet, or any publication whatsoever.
- 15) Any objections must be handed to the secretary in writing within 15 minutes of the class being judged, accompanied by £10. Deposit returnable if the objection is upheld.
- 16) Persons who fail to comply with any of the terms and conditions, or any written notice, or verbal instruction given by an event organiser/steward may be asked to leave the Grey Fern Park Equestrian Centre without refund of any entry fees paid.
- 17) Anyone entering competitions or supporters will have deemed to have given their consent for photographs to be taken and subsequently displayed our website and other social media sites, unless we have been informed to the contrary.
- 18) No professional cameras are permitted to be used on site by anyone other than the photographer.
